The Town Council as Committee Meeting of the Town of Cinco Bayou was called to order by Mayor Usrey at 7:01 P.M.

SILENT PRAYER

MINUTES - Mayor Usrey asked the Council to review the minutes of December 12, and December 19, 1983 Town Council Meetings for approval at the next council meeting.

FINANCIAL REPORT - Mayor Usrey asked the Council to review the financial report for December, 1983 for approval at the next council meeting.

REGULAR BUSINESS

1. FYE 1983 Audit - Mayor Usrey advised the Council that Mrs. Cummins, Creel, Bryan & Gallagher, was present and asked if anyone had any questions regarding the FYE 1983 Audit. There were no questions or comments. Mayor Usrey also advised the Council that a bill for \$3200 has been received from the auditor for the audit.
2. Membership - Committee of 100 - Mayor Usrey advised the Council that the Committee of 100 membership is due for renewal. One year's membership is \$250.00. The Town's representative to the Committee is Mr. Gene Broxson. The Clerk was asked to invite Mr. Broxson to next week's meeting to report on the activities of the Committee. This item will be placed on the agenda for next week's meeting.
3. Boy Scout Anniversary Week Proclamation - Mayor Usrey stated that the Boy Scouts of America have asked for a proclamation designating February 5 through 11 as Scout Week. Opening ceremonies for Scout Week will be held at the Santa Rosa Mall on Monday, February 6 at 6 p.m.
4. Self Insurers Fund Trustees - Mayor Usrey advised the Council

that the Self-Insurers Fund Trustees have asked for nominations for three positions on the Board of Trustees. The Mayor stated that if anyone had any nominations, they were to give them to the Clerk.

5. Proposition One - Mayor Usrey advised the Council that information had been received concerning Proposition One. It states that the Amendment would limit revenue growth to the state and local governments beginning in the fiscal year 1985-1986. The Mayor asked that all Council members read the information. The Clerk added that State Shared Revenue will be affected which will affect the Town. As of now, Proposition One will be on the ballot in November.

6. TV Cable Rate Regulation - Mayor Usrey advised the Council that the FCC has adopted final rules concerning rate controls for TV service. The rates for first tier service are the only rates that can be regulated by local governments. After a brief discussion, Councilman Davis was asked to meet with Mr. Tom Miller, Cosmic Communications, to examine alternative cable systems.

7. Proposed Purchases

After a brief explanation of the above proposed purchases by the Clerk, the Mayor advised that this item will come before the Council at the next meeting.

8. Salamander Contract - The contract with Salamander Security is due for renewal in March. The Clerk advised the Council that Salamander Security has a new owner, Dr. Joe Wilson. The Mayor asked for any ideas and suggestions to improve the security patrol.

A. Streets & Sidewalks - Councilman Davis. Councilman Davis called the Council's attention to the letter from the Okaloosa County Engineer stating that the maintenance responsibilities for Yacht Club Drive were passed to the City of Fort Walton Beach in 1982. Mayor Usrey stated that he had talked with Mr. Heinrich, Okaloosa County Engineer, concerning this situation and Mr. Heinrich stated that Fort Walton Beach had not answered the letter concerning taking over the maintenance responsibilities of the street, so the County would still maintain Yacht Club Drive.

Councilman Davis also brought up the subject of the drainage of cleaning solutions from Ziebart onto Hughes Street that are dissolving the asphalt. After a discussion, it was decided that a survey should be made to determine where the Town boundary

was on Hughes Street. The Clerk was asked to find out the cost of a survey and present it to the Council. The Clerk was also asked to write a letter to Ziebart concerning the chemical composition of their cleaning solutions.

4. Letter - Okaloosa County Engineer - Drainage Ditch/Yacht Club Dr. A letter was received from the Board of County Commissioners concerning maintenance responsibilities for Yacht Club Drive.

CLERK'S REPORT


1. The Clerk advised the Council that the population of the Town as of December 1, 1983 was 246. This was based on the number of residential electrical power meters installed on December 1, 1983 and (180) and applying this number to the population formula resulting from the 1980 census. This new population figure represents a 25% increase over December, 1982.

2. The Clerk advised the Council that the League of Women Voters is in the process of examining city/town charters in the area to insure that each charter provides public access to government and the government processes.

3. The Clerk raised the question of the voter qualification requirements for the Town's elections may not be legal under current Florida Statutes. Attorney Powell was asked to look into this matter and report to Council.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:15 P.M.







CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT entered into this 1st day of March, 1983, between SALAMANDER SECURITY SYSTEMS, INCORPORATED, hereinafter called the "Company"; and TOWN OF CINCO BAYOU, hereinafter called the "Client".

WHEREBY, the parties agree to be bounded as follows:

THE COMPANY, for consideration hereinafter described, does hereby agree to provide patrol services for the Client on the premises located at Cinco Bayou, Okaloosa County, Florida, to-wit: At least five patrols of town streets during the hours of darkness, seven days per week; opening and closing of parks daily at 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. respectively; respond to emergency calls of residents, within reason, otherwise \$25.00 for each response, for a period of one (1) year; said services to begin March 1, 1983.

LIABILITIES:

1. During the contract period, the property and premises of the Client shall not be deemed to be under the care, custody and control of the Company.
2. The Company shall not be liable for the negligent or criminal acts of third parties, either lawfully or unlawfully, on the premises of the Client.
3. The Company is not an insurer and any rates set forth are based solely upon the value of the service provided. Any loss of the Town resulting from failure to provide the patrol, park or emergency call services contracted shall be fixed at \$25.00 as liquidated damages and not as a penalty. Such liability of the Company shall be exclusive, but does not apply to liability covered in Paragraph 4 below.
4. The Company shall be liable and responsible for the negligent acts and omissions and intentional conduct of all its personnel in the performance of this Contract and shall hold the Client harmless therefrom.

5. The Company shall be responsible for transporting assigned personnel to and from the premises of the Client. All guards shall wear the standard company uniform while on duty, unless otherwise requested by the Client in writing. The expense of any special uniform or equipment requested by the Client shall be borne by the Client.

6. The Company shall provide the Client with a written report of all incidents within twenty four (24) hours of the occurrence.

7. The Company shall provide the Client with a certificate of insurance verifying its compliance with all applicable Florida Statutory liability insurance requirements.

WARRANTIES:

1. The Company warrants that it is a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Florida, is duly bonded and licensed by the Florida Secretary of State.

2. The Company warrants that all personnel are qualified by education and experience, and are duly licensed as required by law.

3. That any personnel carrying firearms are duly licensed as required by Florida Law; that no guard shall carry any firearms under this Contract unless specifically so requested and authorized by the Client.

PAYMENT FOR SERVICES:

The Client agrees to pay the Company the sum of \$550.00 per month, due and payable by the 10th day of each month. Payments not received by the 20th day of the month shall be considered delinquent and subject to an interest and service charge of 1-1/2% per month. The parties further agree that should either party seek legal enforcement of this contract, the prevailing party will be entitled to recover costs and reasonable attorney fees resulting therefrom.

Dear Mayor Usrey:

In order to cut through the bureaucratic red tape and make access to the Governor's Office and State agencies in Tallahassee easier and quicker, the Office of Local Government Liaison was established by Governor Graham in 1981. This office is directly administered by me, and at this time we are renewing our efforts to be of assistance to you.

Shirley House of my staff is the new Local Government Liaison and is ready to assist you in any way possible. She has direct access to all agencies in the State and can put you in contact with the proper agency or deliver your message immediately. I hope you will let her help you when you need to contact State agencies in Tallahassee.

So that we may become a better advocate, Shirley will stay in contact with you to provide maximum support and understanding of the needs of local government in Tallahassee. 
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Please be advised that there will be two pre-legislative session public hearings for the above-stated House and Senate districts for Walton and Okaloosa Counties.


