TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
February 4, 1992

Mayor Laginess called the Town Council Meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

REGULAR BUSINESS

1. Minutes - January 7, 1992. Councilman Skelly made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 7, 1992 Town Council meeting as presented, seconded by Councilman Broxson. The motion was unanimously approved.
2. Financial Report - January, 1992. Councilman Gage made a motion to approve the Financial report for January, 1992 as presented, seconded by Councilman Kendrick. The motion was unanimously approved.
3. 1992 Town Election Day. Mayor Laginess explained the Supervisor of Elections request to change the Town's Election Day. Following a short discussion, Councilman Skelly made a motion to change the Town's Election Day to Thursday, October 1, 1992, seconded by Councilman Kendrick. The motion was unanimously approved. Mayor Laginess also called the Council's attention to the letter from Representative Harden and advised that Mrs Hollran, Supervisor of Elections, would reply to the questions posed by Mr. Harden.
4. Code Enforcement Board Appointments. - Mayor Laginess reviewed the list of Code Enforcement Board members and asked the Council to consider reappointing Mr Welch, Mrs Pope and Mr. Black to the Board. Following a short discussion, Councilman Kendrick made a motion to appoint Mr. Welch to a 3 year term effective June, 1991 and to appoint Mrs Pope and Mr. Black to 3 year terms effective June, 1992, seconded by Councilman Gage. The motion was unanimously approved.

COUNCILMEMBERS REPORTS/COMMENTS

Councilwoman Balsley - Expressed concern about the Yucca plants along the right-of-way and the Town's liability should anyone be injured by the sharp pointed fronds. The Town Manager agreed with her concern and stated that they would be removed as soon as possible.

Councilman Gage - (1) The Government Handbooks purchased by the Town have been distributed, one each to Meigs and Pryor Middle Schools. A third handbook, given to the Town by the Florida League of Cities, will be distributed by the Board of Education. (2) The Panhandle League of Cities will hold the Spring Conference on Thursday, March 26, 1992 in DeFuniak Springs. Additional information will be provided at a later date.

Councilman Kendrick - He attended a recent meeting concerning the downtown beautification project and believed the information would be of interest to the Town. The Council agreed and asked Councilman Kendrick to set up the briefing for 5:30 PM, immediately prior to the March Town Council meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:25 PM.



RE: 1992 Election

If passed, the uniform municipal election legislation does not go into effect until January 1, 1993. The date for the 1992 Cinco election will have to be according to the City Code and Ordinances.

The Florida Legislature changed the 1992 second primary date to Thursday, October 1, 1992. The original date was a religious holiday. We are giving you this information for your consideration. The cost for your election would be greatly reduced if it could be held on the October 1, 1992 date.

The qualifying dates would be July 13-17 for the October 1 election. According to our records those required to qualify this year are:

- Irene E. Balsley
- Claude J. Kendrick III.
- Joseph P. Skelly

Further plans can be made and information for the candidates can be put together when a decision about the election date has been made. If you have questions or need further information please call our office.

The 1.5% Election Assessment is still required. In 1991 the compensation for the City Council was \$50.00 per month and the Mayor's compensation was \$100.00 per month. No vouchers were required. Is this still the policy?
