

Town of Cinco Bayou Council Meeting  
March 2, 1959 7:30 p.m.

Present: Gordan Gibson, Billy Gibson, Elbert Davis, Millard Booher,  
and James Rice (sub for Estergren).

The Mayor called the meeting to order and the minutes were read and approved.

Billy Gibson moved that the Council adopt an ordinance entitled "An ordinance providing the method of incurring obligations for the account of the Town of Cinco Bayou" which will follow past ordinances in sequence. Elbert Davis seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Elbert Davis moved the Council accept Resolution #1 which provides for the payment of the \$3,000 to the Chamber of Commerce. Billy Gibson seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Elbert Davis moved that the amendment to Ordinance #4 which changes the utility taxes to 10% and will run in sequence to other ordinances, be adopted. Billy Gibson seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

The ordinances providing for the 10' leeway at back of property and 1200' distance between service stations will have to have public hearings before passage. The will meet on March 23 at 7:30 p.m. for a hearing. This meeting will take the place of the April meeting unless an emergency arises.

Billy Gibson moved the Council move its bank account to the Southern National Bank for an unspecified length of time. Elbert Davis seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Discussion was held about reclaying roads in Cinco and installing our own water system. It was decided to have one more meeting with Ft. Walton and if they refuse to come to sensible terms we will seriously consider building our own water system.

Billy Gibson moved we adjourn and Elbert Davis seconded the motion.
