

Town of Cinco Bayou Council Meeting
March 2, 1964

Present Mayor Gordon Gibson, Attorney Fred Estergren, Martial Joe Ayers, Councilmen Iva Booher, Ronald Gibson, Harold Peek, Ed Laritz Paul Hutchison. Guests: Pete Davis, E. S. Lucas, and Walter Fry.

Minutes of last meeting were read approved.

Ordinance pertaining to garbage explained to guest. Motion made by Laritz, seconded by Ronald Gibson to authorize Clerk to register all qualified persons in Cinco in the registration book that she be paid one dollar an hour for extra time involved.

Reports given by Mayor Gibson on the city finance funds on hand \$9297.42, also have not received statement for the recent installed street lights (Eglin Pkwy and Fifth Avenue). The power of same is being paid by City of Cinco.

Motion made by Paul Hutchison, seconded by Harold Peek discussed, carried four to one, that work on Kelly Street between Beal Street and Eglin Pkwy be next project. Work should begin by June 1 on curb's and gutters.

Re-zoning of Fort Walton Lumber & Supply to legalize the portion now in use according to their zoning request, except Lot #2, it shall remain residential.

Motion made by Laritz, seconded R. Gibson that Lots 2,3,4, and 1 in Block 26 be rezoned commercial but Lot 2, Block 27 shall remain residential. Four for Peek obtained.

Motion made by Laritz, seconded by Peek and carried that no truck traffic be allowed east of Troy Street on Kelly Street and Opp Blvd.

Question brought up concerning Cinco city water.

R. Gibson moved to adjourned, seconded by Peek. Motion carried.
