



6. Councilmember Vacancy - Councilwoman Dumka nominated Lee Borthwick. Mayor Laginess read a letter from Mr. Winfield Davis, former Councilman requesting that he be considered for the vacant position. Councilman Gage nominated Mr Davis. Councilman Skelly made a motion to close the nominations, seconded by Councilwoman Dumka. The motion was unanimously approved. Mayor Laginess called for a vote on the nominees. Councilwoman Dumka voted for Mr Borthwick and Councilwoman Buchanan, Councilmen Gage & Skelly voted for Mr. Davis. Councilman Gage made a motion to appoint Winfield H. Davis to the Town Council for the remainder of the council term vacated by Mike Plaster, seconded by Councilman Skelly. The motion was unanimously approved. Mayor Laginess then presented Councilman Davis with a plaque for his previous service as a member of the Town Council from December, 1979 to November, 1986. Mayor Laginess appointed Councilman Gage to be Mayor Pro Tem.





Dear Mr. Borchik:

Our department has completed a study of the subject intersection. Data collected consisted of pedestrian counts, sign inventory, and pavement marking inventory.

On-site study revealed that from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., Tuesday, April 15, 1986, and 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., Wednesday, April 16, 1986, a total of 12 pedestrians were noted crossing S.R. 85. During these same periods of time a total of 38 pedestrians and 26 bicycles were noted crossing Yacht Club Drive. Persons conducting the study reported that no problems were associated with these crossings.

Further studies were conducted to determine if pedestrian signals are necessary at this intersection. Eight hour pedestrian counts were evaluated using "Traffic Signal Warrant Number Three, Minimum Pedestrian Volume" of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

Results from this evaluation indicate that the installation of these pedestrian features is not justified. Therefore, it is recommended not to install pedestrian signals at this time.

Subject: Participation in Legislative Committee of the Panhandle League of Cities

In order to better represent the interests of the Panhandle area's municipalities, the Panhandle League of Cities is establishing a Legislative Committee. The function of the Legislative Committee will be to communicate with the area's state legislators on legislative issues of interest to the Panhandle League's members. This responsibility will be carried out by the individual members of the committee, primarily, through direct communication with their own legislators only.

Here is how the committee will work. The Florida League of Cities will notify Larry Walker whenever action is needed on a particular legislative issue or bill, whereupon Larry Walker will contact those committee members who might be helpful on the particular issue or bill. In some instances, all members of the committee will be contacted; in others, perhaps only those who are constituents of one particular legislator. Each committee member will be expected to visit or call the legislator or legislators who represent him, regarding the particular issue at hand. In addition, all committee members may be encouraged to

come to Tallahassee for one or more special occasions.

Note: expenses incurred for long-distance telephone calls and possibly for travel mileage will be reimbursed by the League! Neither you nor your municipal budget need suffer financially due to your participation in this committee.

Elected officials of your community are needed to participate in this Legislative Committee. At a minimum, we badly need at least one volunteer from each city and town. If necessary, please discuss this matter at a council meeting and choose at least one elected official to represent your community.
