PUBLIC HEARING - ORDINANCE NO. 110 - An Ordinance providing for public participation in the comprehensive planning process for the Town of Cinco Bayou in conformance with the mandates of Chapter 163, Part II, Florida Statutes and Chapter 9J-5, Florida Administrative Code. Mayor Laginess discussed the ordinance and the need for it and called the Council's attention to several changes that were made to clarify vague and incomplete areas. The Town Manager then read Ordinance No. 110 by title only. Councilwoman Buchanan made a motion to accept the first reading of Ordinance No. 110, seconded by Councilman Skelly. The motion was unanimously approved.

The Special Council Meeting adjourned at 6:12 PM.

COUNCIL AS COMMITTEE MEETING

REGULAR BUSINESS

1. Minutes - Councilman Davis made a motion to accept the minutes of April 8 & April 15 1987 as presented and to place this item on the Consent Agenda, seconded by Councilwoman Dumka. The motion was unanimously approved.

2. Financial Report - Councilman Skelly made a motion to accept the Financial Report for April 1987 and to place this item on the Consent Agenda, seconded by Councilwoman Buchanan. The motion was unanimously approved.

3. Laguna Landing Building Permit - Bldg #2 & Waffle House - Mr. Jeff Prescott explained the proposed construction of the Waffle House and two story office building at the Laguna Landing site. Dr. Hodnutt, a Moorings resident, was present and voiced his objections to the Laguna Landing project, principally concerned with the late hour operation, additional traffic, sounds, smell and aesthetics. He also asked if the developer had considered placing a wall to separate Laguna Landing from the park and adjacent residential property. The letter from Mr. Karns was also read citing similar concerns. Mr. Prescott advised that he would pass the comments and requests to the developer. Councilman Gage made a motion to approve the placement and construction of the Waffle House Restaurant and the two story office building for Laguna Landing and to place this item on the Consent Agenda, seconded by Councilwoman Dumka. The motion was unanimously approved.

4. Travel Adventure's Building Stormwater run-off. Mrs Wise and Mr. Kohut were present to present their request. Following a short discussion, the Council indicated that it would not grant permission to tie the property stormwater system to the existing storm drains on Luverne Street. Councilman Gage made a motion to authorize the developer to plan for the excess stormwater discharge to drain into the existing storm sewer system, to issue a letter to this effect as required by Florida Statutes and to place this item on the Consent Agenda, seconded by Councilwoman Buchanan. The motion was unanimously approved.

5. Board of Adjustment - Following a short discussion concerning the Town's Board of Adjustment, it was decided that since the State Statutes no longer list the powers and duties for the Board, Ordinance No 69 which established the Board be repealed and the Zoning Ordinance be amended to include the Board of Adjustment powers and duties. The Council will convene as the Board of Adjustment when necessary. The Manager will prepare the necessary ordinances.

6. Budget Revision - Following a short discussion, Councilman Skelly made a motion to prepare a resolution revising the Town's operating budget for the FYE 1987, seconded by Councilwoman Dumka. The Manager will prepare the resolution for next week's meeting.

7. Yacht Club Drive Curb & Sidewalk - W. E. Overstreet has submitted a proposal in the amount of \$ 1,200.00 for the engineering, drawings and bid package for the Yacht Club curb and sidewalk on the north side. After a short discussion, Councilman Skelly made a motion to accept Overstreet's proposal, \$ 1,200.00, for the engineering and design on the curb and sidewalk, and to place this item on the Consent Agenda, seconded by Councilman Gage. The motion was unanimously approved.

COUNCILMEMBERS REPORTS/COMMENTS

1. Councilwoman Buchanan advised the Council that following a recent burglary at Kidd Bayou Oaks, it took the Sheriff's Deputy over 15 minutes to arrive on the scene after he had been called. The delay was due to the deputy not being able to locate Kidd Street. The Manager will contact the Sheriff on this matter.

2. On a similar matter, there is concern that AMSEC is not doing as good a job patrolling the Town as they have in previous years. The Manager will talk with Mr. Hook.

ORDINANCE NO. 110

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN THE COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING PROCESS FOR THE TOWN OF CINCO BAYOU, OKALOOSA COUNTY, FLORIDA IN CONFORMANCE WITH THE MANDATES OF CHAPTER 163, PART II, FLORIDA STATUTES AND CHAPTER 9J-5, FLORIDA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE: PROVIDING FOR NOTICE TO REAL PROPERTY OWNERS OF PROPOSED ACTIONS: PROVISIONS FOR GENERAL PUBLIC NOTICE: PROVISIONS FOR OPPORTUNITY FOR WRITTEN COMMENTS; PROVISIONS FOR REQUIRED PUBLIC HEARINGS: PROVISIONS FOR CONSIDERATION OF AND RESPONSE TO PUBLIC COMMENTS: AND PROVISIONS FOR AN EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND/OR ELEMENT UNDER CONSIDERATION.

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature has enacted the Local Government Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Regulation Act (Chapter 163, Part II, Florida Statutes) which mandates the preparation of a comprehensive plan and unified land development code for all units of local government; and,

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Legislature to reconfirm that Sections 163.3161 through 163.3215 have provided the necessary statutory direction and basis for municipal and county officials to carry out their comprehensive planning and land development regulation powers, duties and responsibilities; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 163.3181(1) F.S. establishes that it is the intent of the Legislature that the public participate in the comprehensive planning process to the fullest extent possible; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 163.3181(2), F.S. mandates that procedures be established which provide for broad dissemination of proposals and alternatives, opportunity for written comments, public hearings, provisions for open discussion, communications programs, information services and consideration of and response to public comments; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Florida, through the Department of Community Affairs, has promulgated Chapter 9J-5.004, Florida Administrative Code, to implement the citizen participation process mandated in Chapter 163.3181, F.S.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Cinco Bayou, Okaloosa County, Florida that the procedures/actions described herein are adopted in conformance with the State mandates contained within Chapter 163.3181, F.S. and Chapter 9J-5.004, F.A.C. for use in considering adoption of the Comprehensive plan or any portion thereof and/or any amendments thereto.

Section 1 - Title/Intent

1.1 This Ordinance shall be known as the Citizen Participation Process Ordinance for the Town of Cinco Bayou.

1.2 It is the intent of this Ordinance that all citizens affected by comprehensive planning proposals be encouraged to, and are afforded the opportunity for, input throughout the preparation, adoption, amendment and evaluation/appraisal processes.

1.3 It is further the intent of this Ordinance that these procedures apply to consideration of all draft documents required for preparation of the comprehensive plan, its elements, the formal adoption process of the comprehensive plan, amendments to the comprehensive plan, preparation and adoption of the Evaluation and Appraisal Report, and any other matters deemed appropriate by the Cinco Bayou Town Council.

Section 2 - Definitions

2.1 Unless specifically noted otherwise or listed in this section, the definitions found in Chapter 163, Part II, Florida Statutes and Chapter 9J-5, Florida Administrative Code, are hereby adopted by reference.

2.2 For the purpose of this Ordinance, a workshop is a meeting which usually involves staff level review of the subject material and may not necessarily involve general public involvement. Workshops are used to revise proposed material pursuant to, or in preparation for, public hearings/meetings. Workshops are open to the public, but may not necessarily be subject to the due public notice requirements.

2.3 For the purpose of this Ordinance, a public hearing is a meeting held in conformance with all applicable due public notice requirements at which time a decision by the body holding the hearing is usually rendered.

2.4 For the purpose of this Ordinance, a public meeting is a meeting held in conformance with all applicable due public notice requirements, at which time the proposed material is generally discussed and a decision by the body holding the meeting is not usually rendered.

Section 3 - Notice Procedures

3.1 The Town will advertise twice in a newspaper that is published at least five (5) days per week that a public hearing or public meeting, as the case may be, will be held to consider any of the matters described in Section 1.3. The advertisement will include an identification of who is holding the hearing or meeting as well as the date, time, place and general subject or the hearing or meeting and the location where a summary of the proposed material may be obtained. To the extent possible, the advertisement will appear in a section of the newspaper other than the classified or legal sections. The advertisement will encourage the public to provide written and/or verbal comments on the matters under consideration.

3.2 The advertisements shall appear no earlier than fourteen (14) days prior to the hearing or meeting and no later than five (5) days prior to the hearing or meeting.

3.3 All public hearings and public meetings shall be held after 5:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Workshops may be held at other times deemed appropriate.

3.4 In addition to the advertising requirements described above, a notice of the hearing or meeting will be posted in a conspicuous place or places at least seven (7) days prior to the hearing or meeting. A notice will also be sent to the appropriate media representatives.

3.5 The Town will also provide a direct notice of any hearing or meeting to any group, agency or government that registers with the Town to receive such notice at least seven (7) days prior to the hearing, meeting or workshop. The group, agency or government receiving such notice shall be responsible to notify their membership of the particulars involved.

3.6 The Town will provide notification to the media regarding the status of matters under consideration.

3.7 In addition, the Town will conform to the applicable notice requirements and procedures for adoption of the comprehensive plan or amendment thereto as described in Chapter 163.3184 and 163.3187, Florida Statutes.

Section 4 - Local Planning Agency

4.1 Prior to Town Council approval, adoption and/or enactment as appropriate, of any matter listed in Section 1.3, the Local Planning Agency, as designated by Chapter 12.5, Town of Cinco Bayou Code of Ordinances, shall hold at least one public hearing in conformance with the notice requirements described in Section 3. The hearing may be continued to an announced time certain upon a majority vote. An agenda for the hearing shall be posted in or near the meeting room and available to those in attendance.

4.2 The Local Planning Agency public hearing shall encourage and afford members of the public reasonable opportunity to present their views on any matter under consideration. The Chairman may, at his or her discretion, rule out-of-order public comments he or she deems repetitious or not germane to the matter under discussion.

4.3 The sequence of activities regarding the matters under consideration shall be as follows:

(a) Announcement of the matter for consideration by the Chairman.

(b) Presentation of staff reports/comments, if any, whether written or verbal. Written staff reports, if prepared, shall be provided to the Local Planning Agency, applicable agencies, media, proponents and any group registered pursuant to Section 3.5 at least seven (7) days prior to consideration.

(c) Receipt of comments from the proponents and opponents of the matter in as nearly equal proportions as possible. All speakers will be required to fill out address cards so that an accurate record of participants can be maintained.

(d) Close public input except for direct questions as may be initiated by the members of the Local Planning Agency.

(e) Local Planning Agency discussion, debate and recommendation by majority vote prior to considering the next matter or adjournment.

4.4 the Local Planning Agency shall transmit its recommendation on each matter decided to the Town Council as soon as possible. Included in this recommendation shall be a response to the substantive public comments received during consideration of the matter.

4.5 The Local Planning Agency shall conclude consideration of the agenda no later than 11:00 p.m. No agenda item may be initiated after 10:30 p.m. unless a majority vote agrees to do so. Agenda items not considered at this date will be placed first on the agenda of the next available date that meets the notice requirements of Section 3.

4.6 As soon as practical, a meeting summary or minutes shall be prepared in conformance with the applicable public records laws of the State of Florida.

Section 5 - Town Council

5.1 No sooner than thirty (30) days after the Local Planning Agency makes a recommendation regarding any matter described in Section 1.3, the Town Council shall hold at least one public hearing to consider the recommendation pursuant to the notice requirements described in Section 3. The hearing may be continued to an announced time certain upon a majority vote. An agenda for the hearing shall be posted in, or near, the meeting room and be generally available to those in attendance.

5.2 The Town Council public hearing shall encourage and afford members of the public reasonable opportunity to present their views on any matter under consideration. The Mayor may, at his or her discretion, rule out-of-order public comments deemed repetitious or not germane to the matter under discussion.

5.3 The sequence of activities regarding matters under consideration shall be as follows:

(a) Announcement of the matter for consideration by the Mayor.

(b) Presentation of staff reports/comments, if any, whether written or verbal. Written staff reports, if prepared, shall be provided to the Town Council, applicable agencies, proponents and any group registered pursuant to Section 3.5. The recommendation of the Local Planning Agency shall also be presented in written or verbal form.

(c) Receipt of comments from the proponents and opponents of the matter in as nearly equal proportions as possible. All speakers will be required to fill out address cards so that an accurate record of participants can be maintained.

(d) Close public input except for direct questions as may be initiated by the members of the Town Council.

(e) Town Council discussion, debate and approval, adoption or enactment, as appropriate for the specific matter, by majority vote prior to considering the next matter or adjournment.

5.4 The Town Council shall conclude consideration of the agenda no later than 11:00 p.m. No agenda item may be initiated after 10:30 p.m. unless a majority vote agrees to do so. Agenda items not considered at this hearing will be placed first in the agenda of the next date available that meets the notice requirements of Section 3.

5.5 As soon as practical, a meeting summary or minutes shall be prepared in conformance with the applicable public records laws of the State of Florida.

Section 6 - Advisory Committees

6.1 The Town Council may, from time to time, appoint Advisory Committees to participate in the matters listed in Section 1.3

6.2 Advisory Committee meetings shall be subject to the notice requirements described in Section 3. Workshops conducted by the Advisory Committees are open to the public.

Section 7 - Executive Summaries

7.1 A summary of any matter listed in Section 1.3 under consideration shall be prepared and made available to the public at least fourteen (14) days prior to each public hearing/meeting at which time the matter will be considered.

7.2 As soon as practical after adoption of the Comprehensive Plan, or any amendment thereto, a summary of the document shall be prepared and made available to the public at the cost of reproduction and handling.

Section 8 - Severability

8.1 If any word, sentence, phrase, clause, section or portion of this ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion or word shall be deemed a separate and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section 9 - Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances & Resolutions

9.1 All ordinances and resolutions of the governing body in conflict herewith are repealed.

Section 10 - Effective Date

10.1 This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its final passage and adoption.

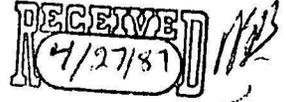

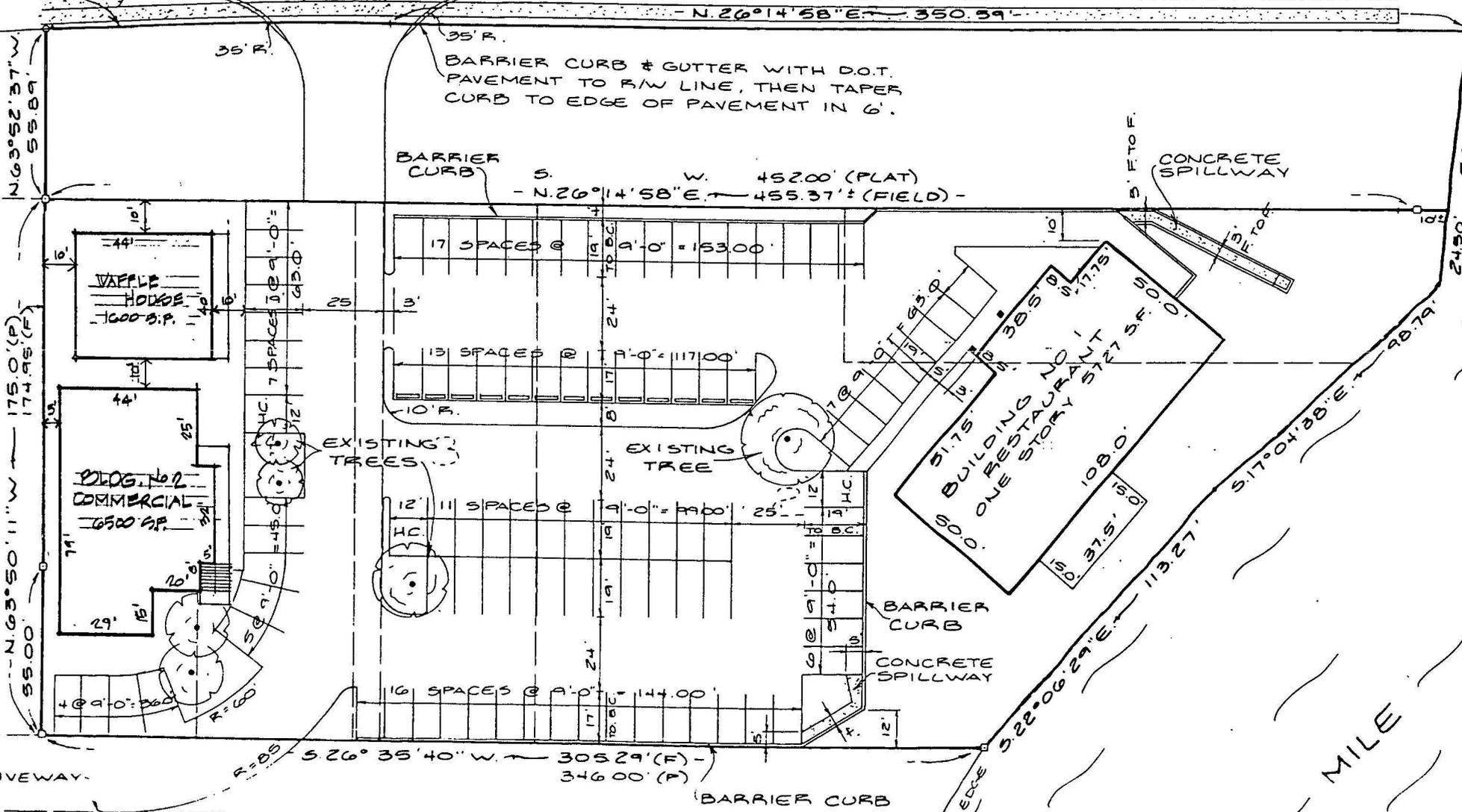

NOTE: Due to busy schedules of various BAC members and the fact that this is a noon-time meeting, every effort will be made to make the meeting as brief as possible (one hour should be adequate).

day and time, until it was deemed necessary to change. Also, recommendations for new BAC members were taken at this time.

AGENDA ITEM SEVEN: Future Activities. Future activities of the MPO bicycle planning staff, as well as BAC projects were discussed. BAC was advised that FDOT had recently been awarded a grant from the oil overcharge settlement with Exxon. A portion of these funds will be available to ten MPO's across the state to hire a full-time research assistant for a period of 2-3 years, and it is hopeful that the Fort Walton MPO will be one of them. One of the main projects that could be undertaken in this area would be a bike suitability map, that would show safe routes for bicycles in the Fort Walton Beach urbanized area. Mr. Bustos also informed the committee that FDOT has videos available relating to bicycle safety, and that these are available to any group requesting them. In addition, FDOT has put together some public information brochures on bicycle safety, touring, riding bikes at night, etc. The most effective way to get these distributed would be to find sponsors (corporate, private nonprofit, etc.) to cover the cost of printing, so we could disseminate large numbers of them.

AGENDA ITEM ONE: Call to Order. Mr. Zeigler called the meeting to order and a brief summary of the last meeting was given, which was a workshop for the purpose of promulgating final goals and objectives for the Fort Walton Beach Bicycle Comprehensive Plan.

AGENDA ITEM TWO: Program Update. Mr. Zeigler announced that he had been promoted to the position of Director for the Transportation Division of the West Florida Regional Planning Council. As a result, Tim Bustos has been hired to coordinate bicycle planning activities for the Fort Walton Beach MPO area.

AGENDA ITEM THREE: Bicycle Comprehensive Plan Summary. Mr. Zeigler informed BAC members that the Bicycle Comprehensive Plan had been adopted by the MPO since the last meeting. Formal plan adoption was in November of 1985. Additional copies of the Executive Summary were passed out to BAC members who had not yet received one. It was reiterated that the structure of the plan was based on the four "E's": Enforcement, Education, Engineering, and Encouragement. Mr. Zeigler further stated that our major objective now is to implement the goals listed in the plan by working through the various agencies and departments that have jurisdiction in the different areas (e.g. the school board, law enforcement agencies, engineering departments, et al).

AGENDA ITEM FOUR: Nomination of Officers. Mr. Zeigler prefaced the discussion by emphasizing the importance of having a chairman and vice chairman to chair the BAC. Individuals not working for local government can often be more effective advocates for getting things accomplished. A resident of the community not employed by local government is free to speak on all issues, and citizen groups command more attention from elected official. Also, a local person is more aware of the needs and concerns of their community than Planning Council staff, because they are much closer to where problems are occurring. Tim Bustos was introduced at this time to carry on the discussion, and accept nominations for officers. After some discussion, Ms. Rosales suggested that Ms. Chere Kuller, a Fort Walton BAC member, may be interested in the position. Ms. Kuller was not able to attend this meeting due to prior obligations, but staff agreed to contact her to see if she was interested prior to the next meeting. Due to the low attendance at this meeting, further action on the subject was delayed until such time as more members could be present.

AGENDA ITEM FIVE: Subcommittee Designation. Staff had wanted to discuss establishment of special subcommittees to work on specific program areas (e.g. enforcement, engineering, education), but discussion was delayed until more BAC members could participate.

AGENDA ITEM SIX: BAC Membership Issues. Discussion centered on whether present time and/or day of the week could be contributing factors to why members could not make it to the meeting. It was decided that since it was the middle of summer, many people may be on vacation, so future meetings would be at the same

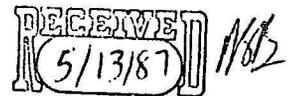

The West Florida Regional Planning Council has recently revised its rules which have changed the membership on the Council. A copy of the rules, which became effective May 11, 1987, are enclosed. As a result of the rule change, membership on the Council has been reduced from a maximum of eight-seven (87) members to twenty-five (25) members. The new rules provide that each county and the major city within each county have voting representation on the Council. Of the twenty-five (25) members, (17) seventeen will be elected officials appointed by participating units of local government and eight (8) members will be appointed by the Governor.

The Council respectfully requests that each of the counties and cities listed appoint their member(s), county commissioner(s) or city councilman, and notify the Council of the appointment.

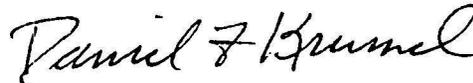
