SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING  
June 9, 1977

Town officials in attendance: Mayor Jim Kendrick, Council members Irene Balsley, Phil Johnston, Will Overstreet, and Max Usrey; Recorder Dee Rouse. Absent: Council member Harold Peek.

Also present were: Miller Burt representing Polyengineering, Ralph Perry, Alice Davis, Bill Zuppa, Mr. & Mrs. Jack Tate, Adelia Robblee, Abbie Tyner, Ruby Watson, and Ophelia Creamer.

Therefore, a quorum being present, Mayor Kendrick opened the meeting at 7:38 p.m.

1. CONTRACT WITH SALAMANDER SECURITY SYSTEMS, INC.-OPENING AND CLOSING OF LAGUNA AND FRANCIS PARKS. Motion by Mrs. Balsley to hire Salamander Security System to open and close the parks for \$100 per month, seconded by Mr. Johnston. In discussion, Clerk informed Council that the Attorney had put his statement within the contract to cover the Town. Mrs. Balsley felt that the Town needed additional protection. Mayor Kendrick informed Council that he approached Charlie Evans of FWB City Hall for possible total police protection; total cost yearly amounted to about \$4800. Clerk also informed Council that he had talked with Charlie Evans, in regards to police protection, it seems that the cost could be similar to the Town's fire protection according to the millage. Town Manager was directed to obtain the cost to Cinco for total police protection. VOTE: Yeas-Balsley & Johnston; Nays-Overstreet & Usrey. Mayor Kendrick broke the tie by voting nay.

2. ADJOURNMENT. Meeting adjourned at 7:47 p.m.

Dear Sirs:

Confirming our recent conversation regarding security patrol for the city parks, we propose the following: we will lock the gates at 8 pm every evening and open at 6 am each morning at Laguna and Francis Parks. We will also patrol these two locations at least twice more each night, seven nights a week. Patrols will also keep a look-out on all of Cinco Bayou during the above mentioned hours. If any unauthorized persons are detected in the parks or loitering around any closed business places, our patrolman will question them or detain for action by the Sheriffs Department. We propose this security patrol at the rate of \$100.00 per month on a one year contract.

Since there are no city police per se for Cinco Bayou, we do have the trained personnel, equipment and facilities to adequately provide security for the entire town if you so desire.

We invite you to visit our office and communications center at any time. We had much rather show you than tell you about our services.
