REGULAR MEETING
JUNE 18, 1984

The Regular Meeting of the Town of Cinco Bayou Town Council was called to order at 7:00 P.M.

SILENT PRAYER

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG

Mayor Usrey requested the Clerk call the roll.

MINUTES - Councilwoman Kelley moved to accept the minutes of May 7, May 14, and May 21 Town Council Meetings as written, seconded by Councilman Johnston. The motion was unanimously approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT - Councilman Davis moved to accept the financial report for May, 1984, seconded by Councilman Perry. The motion was unanimously approved.

REGULAR BUSINESS

1. PUBLIC HEARING - 2nd Reading of Ordinance No. 90, an ordinance amending the current Zoning Ordinance and establishing specific front yard and side yard requirements for townhouses in the Town of Cinco Bayou. Attorney Powell read Ordinance No. 90 by title only. Councilwoman Kelley moved to approve the 2nd reading and adopt Ordinance No. 90, seconded by Councilman Davis. The motion carried unanimously on a roll call vote.
2. PUBLIC HEARING - 2nd Reading of Ordinance No. 91, an ordinance establishing the requirements for all outdoor signs in the Town of Cinco Bayou. Attorney Powell read Ordinance No. 91 by title only. Councilman Davis moved to approve the 2nd reading and adopt Ordinance No. 91, seconded by Councilman Laginess. After a lengthy discussion in which Councilman Johnston expressed his opposition to the ordinance, the motion passed 4 to 1 on a roll call vote with Councilman Johnston voting nay.
3. Town Attorney Position - The Clerk advised the Council that a letter had been sent to Mr. Touchstone advising him of the

interview on June 25, at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Hall. After a brief discussion, it was decided to interview Mr. Gontarek on June 25, at 7:30 p.m. The Clerk will notify Mr. Gontarek.

4. Dance Studio (Yacht Club Drive) - The Mayor advised the Council that plumbing and electrical specifications have been submitted for the Dance Studio and appear to satisfy the requirements. The Clerk suggested that the present building permit ordinance be reviewed and revised to clearly state the requirements for applying for a building permit. After a lengthy discussion, the Mayor advised that this matter would be brought up at next month's meeting.
5. Dodge House Status - Mayor Usrey advised the Council that the Dodge house has been cleared away and to consider the matter closed.
6. Chamber of Commerce Better Business Bureau - Mayor Usrey recommended that Councilwoman Kelley be appointed as representative to the Chamber of Commerce Better Business Bureau Committee. Councilman Johnston made a motion that Councilwoman Kelley be appointed as Better Business Bureau representative from the Town of Cinco Bayou, seconded by Councilman Laginess. The motion passed unanimously.
7. League of Cities Convention Ad - Councilwoman Kelley made a motion to approve the League of Cities Convention Ad at a cost of \$68, seconded by Councilman Perry. The motion passed unanimously.
8. The Committee of 100 - Annual Dues - Mayor Usrey asked for a motion to approve membership in Committee of 100. Membership fee is \$250.00. Councilwoman Kelley moved to renew the membership at a cost of \$250.00, seconded by Councilman Laginess. The motion was unanimously approved.

PUBLIC REQUESTS WILL BE HEARD AT THIS TIME. At this time, Mr. Larry Patrick, local businessman, asked the Council for a special exception allowing him to use a trailer for his office while a new office complex is being constructed on his property, Lots 7, 8, 14 and 15, Block 9, Cinco Bayou Subdivision. Councilman Johnston made a motion to grant the special exception for a six month period, beginning July 1 and ending December 1, and requiring that the trailer be connected to water and sewer facilities, seconded by Councilman Perry. The motion passed unanimously. The Clerk was asked to document the special exception in writing with the prescribed lots and the period of time.

Mayor Usrey advised the Council that Ordinance 92 deletes the 3% occupational license fee on local telephone service and reclassifies it as a franchise fee. The Attorney advised the Council that an emergency ordinance of this nature can be passed by the Council at this time. Attorney Powell read Ordinance No. 92

by title only. Councilman Johnston moved to approve the reading and adopt Ordinance No. 92, seconded by Councilwoman Kelley. The motion passed unanimously.

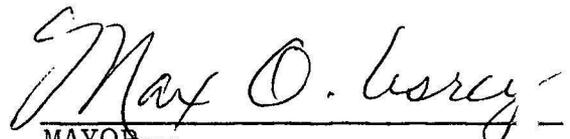
CLERK'S REPORT

1. The Clerk passed out facts and figures concerning purchase of a new copy machine. The Clerk advised the Council that the old machine would be taken in trade with a lease purchase agreement on the new machine at \$98.06 for 36 months with \$750 trade in, with the new machine costing \$2488.00. Councilman Johnston made a motion to buy the new copy machine for cash and include the maintenance agreement for one year or 32,000 copies, seconded by Councilwoman Kelley. The motion passed unanimously.
2. The Clerk advised the Council that the financial disclosure forms that each councilmember received in the mail need to be filled out and mailed as soon as possible.
3. The Clerk advised the Council that the Florida League of Cities Convention will be held October 11-13 at the Hyatt Regency in Tampa and that reservations need to be sent in early. The Clerk also advised that the forms for reservation should be available the early part of July.
4. The Clerk advised the Council that Mr. Plaster, Moorings I, has not come in for a building permit. The Clerk also advise that Mr. White also has not come in for a building permit to construct apartments on Troy Street.
5. The Clerk advised the Council that the Private Industry Council has removed the temporary outside maintenance man because he could not be guaranteed 8 hours of work a day.

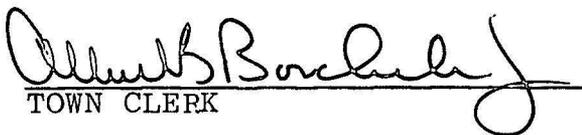
MAYOR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

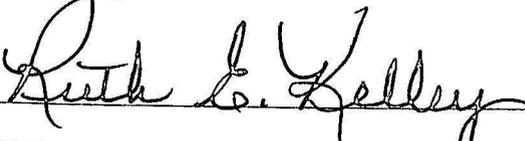

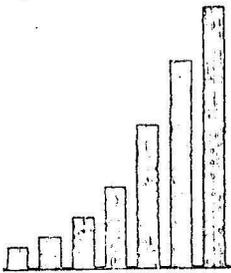

ORDINANCE NO. 92

AN ORDINANCE DELETING SECTION 14-19 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF CINCO BAYOU, FLORIDA, AND ADDING A 3% FRANCHISE FEE TO THE ORDINANCE GRANTING THE TELEPHONE FRANCHISE FOR THE TOWN OF CINCO BAYOU AND PRESCRIBING AN EFFECTIVE DATE THEREON.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Town Council of the Town of Cinco Bayou have reviewed the Code of Ordinances and found Section 14-19 to be in error and desire to correct said error.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CINCO BAYOU, FLORIDA, THAT:

SECTION 1. A. Delete Section 14-19, Occupational License Tax on Telephone Companies, of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Cinco Bayou.

B. Add the following to Section 1. of the Ordinance granting the telephone franchise for the Town of Cinco Bayou.

Franchise Fee. As a condition precedent to the carrying on of any telephone company business within the Town, there is hereby imposed and shall be collected by and paid to the Town an annual franchise fee in the amount of three (3) per cent of the gross receipts of the telephone company's business derived from local exchange service from stations located within the Town.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. If any word, sentence, phrase, clause, section or portion of this ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion or words shall be deemed a separate and independent provision and such holding shall not effect the validity of the remaining portion thereof.

SECTION 3. REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS. All ordinances and resolutions of the governing body in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

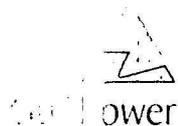

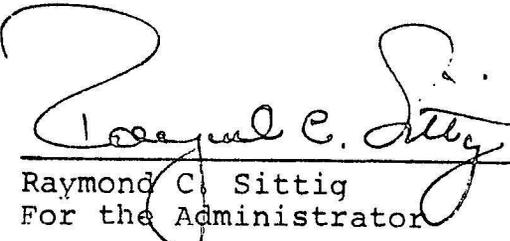

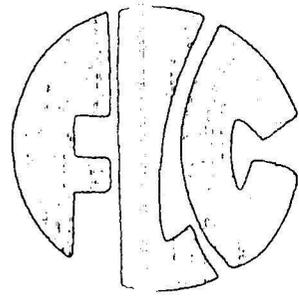

TITLE: "E. HARRIS DREW" Award - Florida's Municipal Official
of the Year"

PURPOSE: This award, sponsored by the Florida League of Cities, will recognize and honor a local elected official who has made a lasting and worthwhile contribution to the citizens of Florida through their efforts and dedication in the performance of their duties on the local level, thus fulfilling the League's motto, "Local Self-Government - Keystone of American Democracy." The Annual Award is named the "E. Harris Drew Award" in memory of Justice Drew who coined the League's motto when he was active in the Florida League of Municipalities in the 1940s and early 1950s. When he was appointed to the Supreme Court in 1952, he was serving as the first vice president of the League. In 1923, when he was admitted to The Florida Bar, he was named Town Attorney for the Town of Palm Beach and soon became active in the League. He expressed a continuing interest in local government throughout his career which was highlighted by his service as Chief Justice of the Florida Supreme Court.

METHOD OF SELECTION: Each year an honoree will be nominated by a selection committee of three appointed by the League President. In September of each year, the Board of Directors will consider the nominees recommended by the selection committee and the recipient of the E. Harris Drew Award will be chosen from this group. That selection will then be announced at the Annual Convention and appropriate honors will be bestowed. The process will then be repeated each succeeding year. A permanent plaque will be placed in the League office and the name of each year's recipient of the E. Harris Drew Award will be added. The plaque will have space for forty names.

NOMINATION PROCEDURE: Nominations may be made by any member and must be submitted by July 15th. This will give the selection committee an opportunity to review the nominations.
