1. PUBLIC HEARING - 1st reading of Ordinance No. 86; an Ordinance repealing Chapter 3, "Animals and Fowl", Town of Cinco Bayou Code of Ordinances. Attorney Powell read Ordinance No. 86 by title only. Councilman Davis moved to approve the first reading of Ordinance No. 86, seconded by Councilwoman Kelley. Motion approved on a roll call vote.

CORRESPONDENCE

1. Letter - League of Women Voters of Okaloosa County. Mayor Usrey brought this letter to the attention of the councilmembers and said if anyone wants any further information to call the phone number in the letter.

2. Letter - Florida Department of Transportation. Mayor Usrey told the Council that the Town had received a letter from the DOT regarding the Council's suggestion to prohibit right turns on red at the Eglin Parkway - Yacht Club intersection. The DOT stated that there was not sufficient cause to prohibit right turns at this time. However, if the Town could supply them with additional information such as accident reports, etc. they would reconsider their decision.

3. Letter - Panhandle League of Cities. Mayor Usrey told the Council that the Panhandle League of Cities will have their Annual Summer Meeting on July 29, at the Harbour House in Panama City. Anyone wishing to attend should let the Clerk know.

CLERK'S REPORT

1. The Clerk advised the Council that the bid from Lancaster Development, Corp. on the reconstruction of the Sea Way Boat Ramp had expired on June 30, 1983. The Clerk stated that Mr. Lancaster is booked up until the end of August and the contract with the State calls for the construction to start prior to August 31, 1983 and be completed by August 31, 1984. The Clerk will check with Mr. Lancaster regarding a new bid and the dismantling of the existing ramp and docks prior to August 31, 1983.

2. The Clerk told the Council he had spoken with Mr. Brown (Audubon Society) regarding the plans for Glenwood Park. The Society was not ready to come before the Council tonight but might be ready by next week.

3. The Clerk reminded the Council about the Florida League of Cities Convention in October. He suggested that those planning to attend make their reservations as early as possible. Discussion followed. It was decided to send the reservations in within the next week.



The "No Right Turn On Red" sign is installed when we have found that this movement causes accidents or is hazardous to pedestrian movements due to the delay that it causes to traffic.


