REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
July 21, 1977

Town officials in attendance: Mayor Jim Kendrick, Council members Irene Balsley, Phil Johnston, Will Overstreet, Harold Peek and Max Usrey; Attorney Powell and Recorder Dee Rouse.

Also present were: Mimi Romaniak representing WFTW; Rachael Godwin, Marj Crawford, Ruth Usrey, Alice Davis, Mrs. Jack Tate, Allen Davis, Ruby Watson, Abbie Tyner and Reverend Talmadge Smith.

Therefore, a quorum being present, Mayor Kendrick opened the meeting with a silent prayer at 7:30 p.m.

1. MINUTES-REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING-JUNE 16, 1977. Motion by Mrs. Balsley to approve as printed, seconded by Mr. Peek. Motion carried unanimously.
2. FINANCIAL STATEMENT-JUNE 1977. Motion by Mr. Johnston to approve as presented, seconded by Mrs. Balsley. Motion carried unanimously.
3. ORDINANCE-FIRST READING-AMENDING ZONING ORDINANCE ALLOWING BLOCKS 4 & 5 TO BE REZONED FROM R-1 (RESIDENTIAL) TO C-1 (LIMITED COMMERCIAL). Attorney Powell performed the reading of this ordinance. Motion by Mr. Peek to accept first reading of the zoning ordinance as read, seconded by Mrs. Balsley. Motion carried unanimously.
4. THE FOLLOWING ITEMS FROM "COUNCIL AS COMMITTEE" WITH RECOMMENDATIONS TO APPROVE:
 - a. CHAMBER DUES-Pay increased annual dues from \$60 to \$125.
Motion by Mr. Peek to pay increased annual dues, seconded by Mr. Usrey.
Motion carried unanimously.
 - b. LEYENDA PARK-Accept Mrs. Balsley's recommendation to fence, install pump, electrical and sprinkler system. Approximate cost: \$2600-\$2800.
Motion by Mr. Johnston to accept recommendation to fence, install pump, electrical and sprinkler system in Leyenda Park, seconded by Mrs. Balsley.
Motion carried unanimously.
5. TRUCK PURCHASE - Bid-O'Connor Ford, Crestview, For a 1977 F-100, 400 V-8, Super Cab Pickup, \$6092.39.

Bid - Creel Ford, DeFuniak Springs, For a 1977 Ford F-100, 302 V-8, Pickup, \$5225.

Motion by Mrs. Balsley to accept bid from Creel Ford Company for a 1977 Ford F-100, 302 V-8, Pickup, approximate cost-\$5225, seconded by Mr. Peek. Motion carried unanimously.
6. HUMANE SOCIETY-ANIMAL CONTROL. Mayor Kendrick named Playground Humane Society as the Town's agent, in accordance with Section 3-17 of our ordinance. He further directed the Clerk to set up the necessary procedures with the Humane Society. Mr. Johnston questioned Section 3-24 (a) pertaining to three days impoundment of a dog. Also, Section 3-36.

7. PAYMENT OF CLERK'S EXPENSE TO INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTE OF MUNICIPAL CLERKS, KANSAS CITY, MAY 21-26, \$574.54. Motion by Mr. Johnston to reimburse the Clerk for his expenses to IIMC, seconded by Mrs. Balsley. During discussion, Mr. Peek suggested that this item be budgeted for next year. VOTE: Yeas-Balsley, Johnston, Peek; Opposed-Overstreet, Usrey.
8. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE-DUE BY AUGUST 1, 12'NOON. Attorney Powell informed Council that the Town Clerk received information from his City Clerk's memo stating that Financial Disclosure forms should be in by August 1, 12'noon. Attorney feels that it is not a must to comply with this. Attorney will check and if it is required, he will get disclosure forms.
9. PUBLIC HEARING PERTAINING TO FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING FUNDS. Clerk informed Council that a requirement from the Federal Government pertaining to the Federal Revenue Sharing Funds that the Town have at least one public hearing in which the citizens of the Town can participate in making any suggestions for the use of Federal Revenue Sharing Funds. Public hearing will be held next month on August 18, Regular Council Meeting, regarding funds received for Entitlement Period 8.
10. TIME CHANGE FOR TOWN'S MEETINGS. Motion by Mr. Usrey to change Council as Committee meetings and Regular Council meetings from 7:30 p.m. to 7 p.m., seconded by Mrs. Balsley. Motion carried unanimously. Clerk indicated he would notify news media and publish legal notice as required.
11. AUTOBON SOCIETY. Mrs. Usrey indicated that the Autobon Society was still working on the Glenwood Park project and would be having another meeting soon.
12. CHURCH PARKING. Reverend H. Talmadge Smith asked of Council, if there was anything the Church could do to enable them to continue parking on Yacht Club Drive during Sunday services. After lengthy discussion, Mayor Kendrick asked Reverend Smith to get two or three members of his church and church attorney to meet with our Attorney, Mr. Peek, Mr. Johnston and Mr. Overstreet to discuss this situation. He further asked Reverend Smith to inform Clerk when his committee could meet so our committee members could be informed.
13. ADJOURNMENT. Meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE ADOPTED AUGUST 3, 1964, BY THE TOWN OF CINCO BAYOU, FLORIDA; BEING AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A ZONING PLAN WITHIN THE TOWN OF CINCO BAYOU, FLORIDA; CREATING THREE DISTRICTS, REGULATING AND RESTRICTING THE LOCATION AND USE OF BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES AND LAND FOR TRADE, INDUSTRY, RESIDENCES OR OTHER PURPOSES, THE HEIGHT AND SIZE OF STRUCTURES, THE SIZE OF OPEN SPACES FOR LIGHT AND VENTILATION; ADOPTING A MAP OF SAID DISTRICTS, DEFINING TERMS USED; PROVIDING FOR THE ADJUSTMENT, ENFORCEMENT AND AMENDMENT THEREOF, DESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF, SAID AMENDING ORDINANCE CHANGING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE R-1 "MULTIPLE FAMILY DWELLING DISTRICT" WITH RESPECT TO BLOCKS 4 and 5, CINCO BAYOU SUBDIVISION TO C-1 "LIMITED COMMERCIAL DISTRICT" UPON THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP ADOPTED AUGUST 3, 1964; SEVERING INVALID PORTIONS OF SAID AMENDED ORDINANCE; REPEALING ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT WITH SAID AMENDED ORDINANCE AND PRESCRIBING AN EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Cinco Bayou, Florida, as follows:

SECTION 1: From and after the effective date of this ordinance, Section 3 of that ordinance adopted August 3, 1964, creating various districts in the Town of Cinco Bayou, Florida, be and it is hereby amended to change the districts designated on this zoning map and accompanying the foregoing ordinance of August 3, 1964, so as to redistrict the following described blocks:

Blocks 4 and 5, Cinco Bayou Subdivision, according to plat thereof on record in the public records of Okaloosa County, Florida,

from an R-1 "Multiple Family Dwelling District" to a C-1 "Limited Commercial District" zoning designation. The boundaries of the district reflected upon the map accompanying the original zoning ordinance dated August 3, 1964, as amended, are hereby changed upon the map accompanying such ordinance and made a part thereof and shall be designated the "Official Zoning Map of the Town of Cinco Bayou, Florida," dated August 3, 1964. Said map and all other notations, references and other information shown thereon are as much a part of this ordinance as if the information set forth thereon were fully described and set out herein.

SECTION 2: Should any section, clause or provision of this ordinance be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the

ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the parts so declared to be invalid.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or partial ordinances in conflict herewith by the Town of Cinco Bayou, Florida, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the passage and approval by the Mayor.

CHAPTER 3

ANIMALS AND FOWL

- Art. I. In General, § § 3-1---3-15
Art. II. Dogs, § § 3-16---3-36
Div. 1. Generally, § § 3-16---3-30
Div. 2. License, § § 3-31---3-36

Charter reference---Authority of town to prevent animals from running at large, § § III(s).

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Sec. 3-1. CRUELTY TO ANIMALS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to be cruel to any animal by beating, torturing, mutilating, clearly failing to provide food, drink or shelter, or by abandoning animals. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 10)

Secs. 3-2---3-15. RESERVED.

ARTICLE II. DOGS

Division 1. Generally

Sec. 3-16. DEFINITIONS.

For the purposes of this article, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by this section:

Dog shall mean a male, female or spayed female dog.

Owner shall mean any person harboring or keeping a dog for more than ten (10) days. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 2)

Sec. 3-17. DOG WARDEN---APPOINTMENT; DUTIES.

The mayor shall designate a town dog warden, who shall be the town marshal or an agent of the playground humane society. The dog warden shall keep proper records and accounts and make such reports as may be required by the mayor, and shall have all the powers of a police officer in the enforcement of this article. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 6)

Sec. 3-18. TOWN TO OPERATE DOG SHELTER OR CONTRACT FOR SERVICES OF DOG SHELTER.

(a) The town shall operate, either independently or in cooperation with others, a suitable place for the impounding and care of and final disposal of all dogs impounded under the terms of this article to be known as the dog shelter.

(b) The town may contract for the use of a dog pound, or other services required by this article. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 11)

Sec. 3-19. DUTY TO RENDER AID UPON STRIKING DOG WITH VEHICLE.

It shall be unlawful for any person who has knowingly struck a dog by a vehicle under his control to fail to render first aid to such dog by taking it to a veterinarian or by notifying the owner, the dog warden or the police. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 10)

Sec. 3-20. DOGS NOT ALLOWED UNLEASHED IN PUBLIC PLACES; IMPOUNDMENT.

No dog shall be allowed in public places such as railroad stations, hotels, restaurants, theaters, public conveyances or similar places, or in grocery stores or other establishments selling food or staple goods, unless on a suitable and dependable leash. Dogs found in violation of this section shall be impounded. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 4)

Sec. 3-21. BARKING, HOWLING, VICIOUS DOGS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, harbor or own a dog which by loud and frequent or habitual barking, yelping or howling, or by constant or frequent threat of attacking and biting, shall annoy anyone in the neighborhood or people passing in the street. It shall be unlawful for any owner to keep any vicious dog except within a suitably fenced enclosure. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 9)

Sec. 3-22. DOGS IN HEAT TO BE CONFINED; IMPOUNDMENT.

It shall be unlawful for any owner to permit a dog in heat to be upon the streets or in any other public place; such dogs shall be kept securely confined upon private premises. Dogs in heat and not properly confined shall be impounded. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 5)

Sec. 3-23. QUARANTINE OF BITING AND RABID DOGS.

When a dog has bitten some person or is otherwise suspected of being rabid by the dog warden, it shall, upon written notice to the owner by the dog warden, be quarantined. The owner may board the dog at an approved veterinarian hospital. Should the owner fail to comply with such quarantine, the dog warden shall immediately impound such dog with an approved veterinarian and quarantine it at cost to the owner. Such quarantined dogs shall be kept quarantined until released by the county health department. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 8)

Sec. 3-24. IMPOUNDMENT AND REDEMPTION PROCEDURE; FEES.

(a) An impounded dog shall be kept for three (3) days unless claimed sooner by the owner. On the fourth day the dog warden shall segregate any dogs suitable for adoption by a new owner and shall destroy all other unclaimed dogs.

(b) The owner of a dog impounded for failure to have a proper license may redeem such dog upon payment of a three dollar (\$3.00) pound fee and one dollar (\$1.00) per day per dog for board, or the actual cost to the town for the payment of any contractual services in connection with such impoundment, and by securing a license as required by this article.

(c) The owner of any dog impounded under the provisions of this article, except for failure to secure a license or for dogs held for quarantine purposes, may redeem such dog within three (3) days and upon payment of one dollar (\$1.00) per day board, or the actual cost to the town for the payment of any contractual services in connection with such impoundment. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 11)

Secs. 3-25---3-30. RESERVED.

Division 2. License

Sec. 3-31. REQUIRED.

It shall be unlawful for any person to keep a dog more than three (3) months old, within the town, without first having obtained a license therefor. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 3)

Sec. 3-32. FEES.

The fee for a license required by this division shall be one dollar (\$1.00) for each male or spayed female dog and two dollars (\$2.00) for each female dog which has not been spayed. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 3)

Sec. 3-33. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE AND TAGS; AFFIXING TAG TO COLLAR.

Upon application for a license required by this division and the payment of the required fee, together with a certificate of vaccination against rabies by a practicing veterinarian within five (5) months immediately preceding the application, the town clerk shall issue a license to expire on the last day of December of the current year. The town clerk shall also arrange with the playground humane society to issue both the license and metal tag as agents for the town. The metal tag must be securely fastened to a collar or harness of the dog and be worn at all times by the dog for which the license was issued. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 3)

Sec. 3-34. TRANSFER OF LICENSE; FEE.

A license issued pursuant to this division may be transferred by the town clerk to a succeeding owner for the unexpired portion of the calendar year upon payment of fifty cents (\$0.50). (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 3)

Sec. 3-35. REPLACEMENT LICENSE TAGS; FEE.

Upon proof that a license tag issued pursuant to this division has been lost, and upon the payment of twenty-five cents (\$0.25), the town clerk shall issue a duplicate license tag. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 3)

Sec. 3-36. UNLICENSED DOGS TO BE IMPOUNDED.

Upon finding any dog unlicensed, in its owner's possession or on the premises of the owner, or upon the public streets or other public places, or upon property other than that of the owner of the dog, the dog warden shall immediately impound such dog in the dog shelter. (Ord. of 8-27-62, § 7)

Humane Society Hired

CINCO BAYOU—The Humane Society was designated Cinco's dog warden by Mayor Jim Kendrick's Thursday night during the town council meeting.

After hearing the town's ordinances concerning animals and fowl, the mayor used his powers to appoint a warden and chose the society for the job.

Kendrick's further directed town manager Jim Godwin to complete the matter with the society's director Jean Luciana. At this time the town's animal control ordinances will be turned over to the society for enforcement.

The issue of on-street parking on Yacht Club Drive was resurrected by Cinco Baptist Pastor H. Talmadge Smith when he asked the council to reconsider its ban and allow his parishioners to use the street for parking on Sundays.

Under advisement of town attorney Rick Powell the council had previously disallowed parking on any driving lane in the town.

A committee which included Powell, council members Harold Peek, Phil Johnston and William Overstreet was appointed by the mayor to meet with a similar committee from the church to solve the parking situation.

Future council meeting times were advanced to 7 p.m. on the second and third Thursdays of the month from the old meeting time of 7:30 p.m.

In other action the council gave the stamp of approval to matters that were virtually approved at last week's council committee meeting. They voted:

—Agreed to go ahead with plans for revitalizing Leyenda Park with grassing, sprinkler system and fencing. The projected cost for the work is \$2,600.

—Accepted a bid from Creel Ford of DeFuniak Springs for a 1977 pick-up truck to be used in maintenance of the town.

—Voted to pay the increased Chamber of Commerce dues of \$125.

—Agreed to pay the expenses for Godwin's attendance in May to the International Institute of Municipal Clerks.
