

Town of Cinco Bayou Council Meeting
September 8, 1958 7:30 p.m.

Present: Gordan Gibson, William Gibson, L.P. Disharoom, Millard Booher, Paul Hutchison, Elbert Davis, Fred Estergren, and Joe Etheridge (guest).

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor and the minutes were read and approved.

Joe Etheridge requested permission to erect a temporary tin building for storage space on his highway lot. This would have been contrary to the town ordinance which calls for a masonry front. Elbert Davis moved that the request be declined and LP Disharoon seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Elbert Davis, Millard Booher, and Billy Gibson will meet with Fort Walton concerning the water franchise on September 8, 1958. If they will not come to terms that will help Cinco Bayou, the Council favor rejecting their offer to buy our water system. Billy Gibson moved that the Council adopt the proposed notice of election, and Elbert Davis seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous. The books will be open September 16 - 26 and election day is October 7, 1958.

The proposed clerk and inspectors for the election are Mrs. Joe Ayers Mrs. Millard Booher, and Mrs. Winton McNair. Elbert Davis moved that they be accepted and Paul Hutchison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

Elbert Davis moved that the Council authorize Fred Estergren to contact Phil Johnston concerning the moving of the part of his pier that runs over the Cinco boundary. Billy Gibson seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

L.P. Disharoon moved that the parks be surveyed and fenced. Elbert Davis seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Elbert Davis moved that the meeting be adjourned and Billy Gibson seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.
