The Special Meeting of the Town of Cinco Bayou was called to order by Mayor Usrey at 7:02 P.M.

1. PUBLIC HEARING - Ordinance to adopt the Tax Millage Rate for FYE 1983. Attorney Powell read Ordinance NO 82 by title only. Councilman Davis moved to adopt Ordinance NO 82, seconded by Councilwoman Kelley. Motion approved unanimously.
2. PUBLIC HEARING - Resolution to adopt the Operating Budget and Capital Improvement Budget for FYE 1983. Attorney Powell read Resolution NO 82-7 by title only. Councilwoman Kelley moved to adopt Resolution NO 82-7, seconded by Councilman Wade. Motion approved unanimously.
3. Resolution to Declare Candidates Elected. Attorney Powell read Resolution NO 82-6 by title only. Councilman Perry moved to adopt Resolution NO 82-6, seconded by Councilman Davis and approved unanimously.

COUNCIL AS COMMITTEE MEETING

REGULAR BUSINESS

1. Guardian Corporation Proposal - Mr. Charles E. McDaniels President of Guardian Security, presented a detailed proposal to the Council regarding their security plan for the Town of Cinco Bayou. After a lengthy discussion, Mayor Usrey advised Mr. McDaniels that the Council would make a decision on the proposal at the next Regular Council Meeting and he would be advised of their decision.

2. Boat Docks - Kidd Bayou Oaks Townhomes. Clerk Borchik explained the plan for the Kidd Bayou Oaks Townhome Docks as prepared by the Lancaster Development Corporation, designer and proposed builder of the dock, which would consist of dock space for eight (8) boats. The Council, following a lengthy discussion agreed that it would be alright for Lancaster Development to submit the proposed plans to the state for a permit.

3. Ordinance Enforcement - Okaloosa County Sheriff's Department. This item was discussed under item 1.

4. Membership - Florida League of Cities. The Council discussed the Membership Fee of \$150.00 and noted that funds are in the Budget for FYE 1983.

CORRESPONDENCE


1. City of Cocoa Beach Letter - Community Service Tax. The City of Cocoa Beach requested the Town of Cinco Bayou to participate in a project to have the State Legislature make a provision for communities to charge a "Community Service Tax". This tax would be a local option. Participation by the Town of Cinco Bayou would mean sending a Resolution to the State Legislature.
2. Blue Ribbon Marina Committee Letter. This committee is a special committee to research submerged land and to determine the lease fees to be charged for said land. The meetings will be held October 19, October 20, and October 21, at Marina Bay

Some Florida cities need tourists and resort development for economic reasons. Other cities need revenue to cope with the added burdens on city services imposed by transient populations. And some cities need both.

I am enclosing herewith a Cocoa Beach resolution asking the State Legislature to make provisions for a local-option "community services tax" on transient rentals, to help communities which need to cope with present or prospective future transient loads. Also, a proposed bill covering the same ground.

All revenue would go to local services. Tourist promotion is already provided for in a different statute.
