The four candidates, who were unopposed in their races, will take off November 1. Jim Kendrick, former councilman, became Mayor-elect when Mayor Ken Smith chose not to file for reelection.

Harold Peek goes into another term of office as a councilman, and Phil Johnston will fill the seat on the council vacated by Kendrick.

Robert Waddell is the new town marshal.

Town officials in attendance: Council members Irene Balsley, Jim Kendrick, Will Overstreet, Harold Peek, and Max Usrey; Attorney Rick Powell and Recorder Dee Rouse. Absent: Mayor Ken Smith.

Also present were: Phil Johnston, Adelia Robblee, Marjorie Crawford, Abbie Tyner, and Ruby Watson.

Therefore, a quorum being present, Mayor ProTem Peek took the Mayor's chair and opened the meeting at 7:30 p.m.

1. MINUTES-REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING-SEPTEMBER 16, 1976. Motion by Mr. Kendrick to approve as printed, seconded by Mr. Overstreet. Motion carried unanimously.
2. FINANCIAL STATEMENT-SEPTEMBER 1976. Motion by Mrs. Balsley to approve as presented, seconded by Mr. Usrey. Motion carried unanimously.
3. PAVING IRWIN AVENUE(BETWEEN BEAL AND EGLIN PARKWAY). Council agreed to get a couple of bids to resurface Irwin Avenue and bids will be presented at the next Council as Committee Meeting.
4. REQUEST FROM COUNTY COMMISSIONERS: REF: INSTALLATION OF SEWER AND WATER LINES THROUGH PORTIONS OF CINCO BAYOU.

Mr. Overstreet suggested that this matter be held until next council meeting.

5. FIRE PROTECTION MILLS. Clerk informed Council that he had received a letter from Mr. Charley Evans, Fort Walton Beach, indicating that our fire protection mills will be 3.82 for this year.
6. ELECTION RESULTS. Clerk informed Council that no formal election was conducted October 5, 1976, due to no opposition to candidates who had filed. The following will assume offices on November 1, 1976: Mayor Jim Kendrick, Councilman Phil Johnston, Councilman Harold Peek, and Town Marshal Robert Waddell.
7. GAVEL AND SILVER TRAY FOR MAYOR KEN SMITH. Motion by Mr. Overstreet for the Town Clerk to secure a gavel and silver serving tray to be presented to Mayor Ken Smith, seconded by Mr. Kendrick. Motion carried unanimously.
8. CINCO BAPTIST CHURCH-PARKING PROBLEM ON YACHT CLUB DRIVE. Clerk informed Council that he talked with Barney Parker and his committee's proposal would be brought before the church for their approval; then he will present the proposal in writing to the Council at the next meeting.
9. ADJOURNMENT. Meeting adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
