

Town of Cinco Bayou Council Meeting
November 5, 1968

Cinco Bayou Council Meeting, 7:30 p.m. Present Mayor Ronald Gibson
Attorney ^{Lotterman,} Councilmen Iva Booher, Edward Laritz, Paul Hutchison, Lowell
Taylor, and Peter Sonnenberg.

Minutes of the previous meeting was read. Councilman Taylor moved
to accept minutes as read, seconded by Councilman Laritz. Motion carried.

Councilman Sonnenberg moved to accept financial report, seconded by
Councilman Taylor. Motion carried.

Discussion on catalogue from water, server reports to discontinue-
reported the gas heater for the Town Hall has been installed, the electric
heater was not accepted as trade-in, therefore, it is to be sold for \$35.

Mayor Gibson has someone to help cut the dead trees along the high-
way and parks. A motion made by Councilman Taylor, seconded by Councilman
Sonnenberg approved by the Council, that street signs be repainted, install
caution sign at Troy Street and Opp Blvd. Paint strips at dip on Opp Blvd
caution signs and others be erected where they are needed. Mayor asked
State Road Dept for Cinco Bayou sign for Yacht Club Drive.

The Council suggested Mayor Gibson and Councilman Sonnenberg check
on christmas tree lights and decorations and installations. Motion made
by Councilman Laritz, seconded by Councilman Hutchison motion carried that
Mayor Gibson and Councilman Sonnenberg check on lights, Christmas decorations
and installation.

Councilman Taylor moved to get estimate to pave Opp Blvd where present paving stops to Yacht Club Drive.. Also estimate from Yacht Club Drive to $\frac{1}{2}$ distance to where paving ends on Opp Blvd. Motion seconded by Councilman Sonnenberg. Motion carried.

Mayor Gibson asked Attorney Estergren to be prepared to have new elected officers sworn into oath of office at next meeting.

Being no further business, Councilman Laritz moved the meeting adjourn, seconded by Councilman Sonnenberg. Motion carried.
