PUBLIC HEARING - ORDINANCE NO. 118 - An ordinance amending Section 7 (b) of Ordinance No. 108; authorizing the Franchisee to enter into written commercial sanitation service contracts; Repealing all ordinances in conflict herewith; Providing for an effective date hereof. Attorney McInnis read Ordinance No 118 by title only. Councilman Davis made a motion to accept the second reading, seconded by Councilwoman Dumka. The motion was unanimously approved. Councilwoman Dumka Made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 118, seconded by Councilwoman Buchanan. The motion was unanimously approved on a roll call vote.

REGULAR BUSINESS

CONSENT AGENDA - Councilwoman Dumka made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda, specifically, agenda items 1, 3 & 4, seconded by Councilman Davis. The motion was unanimously approved.

2. Financial Report - October 1987 - Councilman Davis made a motion to accept the Financial report for October, 1987, seconded by Councilwoman Buchanan. The motion was unanimously approved.

5. Parking Lot & Storage Building - Following a short discussion, Councilwoman Dumka made a motion to table this item, seconded by Councilman Davis. The motion was unanimously approved. A workshop to discuss this item was scheduled for Wednesday, November 18, 1987, immediately following the Special meeting on the Comprehensive Plan.

6. Building Permit - Ready Bank - Mr Seymour was present to explain the proposed modification to the old Morris Pharmacy building and the building additions necessary for the Ready Bank. No variances or special exceptions are necessary. Councilwoman Buchanan made a motion to grant a building permit for this construction activity, seconded by Councilwoman Dumka. The motion was unanimously approved.

COUNCILMEMBERS REPORTS/COMMENTS - Councilman Davis expressed concern about the vehicles parking on the grass and right of way behind Cost Chopper on Irwin Avenue. The Town Manager will speak to the Cost Chopper Manager about this.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT - None


Attorney McInnis advised the Council that he would be out of Town for the Special meeting but would provide a replacement.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 6:40 PM.




PROPOSED ADDITION & RENOVATION OF THE

SCALE:  $\frac{1}{8}'' = 1'-0''$


KELLY AVE. 50' R/W

LUVERNS ST. 30' R/W









**JUSTICE BEN F. OVERTON** is the first Florida Supreme Court Justice to be selected under the merit selection process (effective January 1, 1973), which was designed to remove Florida's judicial system from politics and to improve the quality of the state's courts. He is the senior member of the Court, having been appointed by Governor Askew on March 27, 1974, and served a term as Chief Justice from 1976 to 1978. While Chief Justice, he was a member of the Executive Council of the Conference of Chief Justices and served as chairman of the Conference's Special Committees on Cameras in the Courtroom and Judicial Education.

Justice Overton is the Chairman of the United States Constitution Bicentennial Commission of Florida and the Judicial Council of Florida. In 1984 he chaired the Supreme Court's Article V Review Commission; in 1978 he chaired the Florida Appellate Structure Commission. He was the first chairman of the Florida Institute for the Judiciary created by the Supreme Court to be responsible for educational courses for judges and is the present chairman of its successor, the Florida Court Educational Council.

Justice Overton was born on December 15, 1926, in Green Bay, Wisconsin. He received a B.S. in Business Administration and a J.D. in Law from the University of Florida and an LL.M. in Jurisprudence from the University of Virginia. He has received honorary Doctor of Law degrees from Stetson University and Nova University.

Before his selection as a Supreme Court Justice, he served for nearly ten years as a circuit judge (in both the civil and criminal divisions), during which time he was chief judge of his circuit for three and one-half years and was chairman in 1973 of the Florida Conference of Circuit Judges. Previously, he was engaged in the private practice of law in St. Petersburg.

In 1984 he was awarded the Florida Bar Foundation's Medal of Honor for his contribution to the administration of justice. He received, in 1980, the Outstanding Jurist Award from the Florida Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers and, in 1978, the St. Thomas More Distinguished Service Award from the Archdiocese of Miami.

He is active in the American Bar Association; he served as chairman of the subcommittee that drafted Standards for the Enforcement of Judicial Discipline and as chairman of the Task Force that drafted Standards on Competency to Stand Trial. He now serves on the Council of the Section of Legal Education. He was a member of the board of directors and secretary of the American Judicature Society and is a Fellow of the American Bar Foundation.

Justice Overton was a part-time faculty member at Stetson University College of Law until his appointment to the Supreme Court. He served for nine years, starting in 1968, on the faculty of the National Judicial College and has served since 1976 on its Board of Directors. He chaired the Florida Bar Continuing Legal Education Committee from 1971-1974.

He has been a lay reader, vestryman, and senior warden of the Episcopal Church, and is a Rotarian. He is a Retired Reserve Officer in the Judge Advocate General Corps, United States Army.

He and his wife, Marilyn, were married in 1951, and they have three children, Cathi, Robert, and William.
